45. **Declarations of Interest:** There were no declarations of interest.

Open Session

The committee received a presentation from Grace Harland and Diana Hammond, of Affinity Water, who outlined a proposal for environmentally improving the River Misbourne at Barn Meadow.

46. Matters arising from the Approved Minutes of 3 December 2018

There were no matters arising.

47. To consider and approve the river restoration works proposed by Affinity Water

Following discussion and the aforementioned presentation, the committee **agreed** that improvements to the River Misbourne at Barn Meadow and Pondwicks would be beneficial and as such stated that, in principal, they would be happy for the recommended improvement works to take place. However, this is on the proviso that the residents of the High Street, who back onto the river and the Amersham Society are fully consulted and subsequently agree to these low intervention improvements. The committee instructed the Clerk to liaise with the Amersham Society and the residents in collaboration with Affinity Water.

48. To discuss the invitation from the Burgermeister inviting the Mayor and delegation to Bensheim in April

The committee noted the invitation from Bensheim, **confirming** that Councillor Walsh shall join the Town Mayor and her partner as the Council's officially delegation visiting Bensheim in April.

49. Amersham in Bloom Items

(i) Amersham in Bloom Update

The report circulated prior to the meeting detailed the Amersham in Bloom highlights over the past two months. The report noted the following:

- 500 native trees donated by the Conservation Volunteers were planted in conjunction with 75 local residents, including Scouts from 2nd Amersham on the Hill Scout Group.
- 30 heritage fruit trees have been planted at Hervines Park creating Hervines Community
 Orchard. The trees have been sponsored by residents, while money obtained from the *Tesco*Bags for Help initiative has funded the purchase of materials, such as caging and wild grass
 seed.
- Five students from Stony Dean School have continued to volunteer two hours a week. Over the
 past two months they have assisted the depot to 'side out' vegetation that is over growing
 footpaths, litter picked, constructed a compost bin for Pondwicks and removed evasive holly
 from Willow Wood.
- A student with special needs has been working with the Council and Bloom volunteer Carole,
 1.5hrs a week, enabling him to obtain work experience that he has struggled to gain elsewhere. Christian is helping to make environmental improvements in Pondwicks.
- The depot shredded 378 Christmas trees in January. The chippings have been used by allotment holders, Stony Dean School and within our parks.

(ii) To consider and recommend the purchase of hanging baskets for the town

The Town Clerk's report circulated prior to the meeting was noted. Following discussion the Committee **approved** hiring hanging baskets from Windowflowers, as highlighted:

64 baskets in Old Amersham at a cost of £3302- Old Amersham 57 baskets for AOTH at a cost of £2964- AOTH

Total cost: £6266 (taken from proposed hanging basket budget)

It was also **agreed** that the Council facilitate the hire of hanging baskets on behalf of those shopkeepers and residents that have premises on one of the town's main thoroughfares.

50. To consider the purchase of bunting for Sycamore Road, Broadway and the Memorial Gardens

The report circulated prior to the meeting was considered. The Committee noted that bunting adds vibrancy and colour to Amersham and therefore **agreed** to purchase durable PVC Union bunting at a cost of £1501.50.
